0) Public participation:

No public present.

1) Apologies for absence:

Broadband @ Village Hall:

Yet another problem as BT are now saying that their cheapest package is £13 per month and the installation charges are different to the figures previously quoted. Clerk said that she was at a loss as to know what to do!

Couch at Dr's Surgery:

Councillors discussed the recent plans for the trees on this site and would comment as follows:

- 1. Surprised at the change of planning thoughts as when Councillors met with the Headteacher, Architect and Planning Officer they were assured that no treeshedge would be removed. Why has this now changed?
- 2. Feasibility of pollarding the trees should be looked into with the minimum amount of trees being removed only if necessary.
- 3. Stottesdon is a Conservation Area and permission has already been granted for some trees to be removed on this site.

4. There does not appear to have been enough consultation with neighbours and this is very important as their privacy will be affected. Please ensure that they are consulted. *Cllr Millington was called back into the room.*

15/04967/FUL Land adj to Fox & Hounds High Street Stottesdon:

Clerk had received the following letter:

"Please be advised that following an agenda setting meeting in February, the Chair and Vice Chair took the following view:

Delegate – Scheme clearly SAMDev compliant; given planning history of previous permissions adds to acceptability in principle; The designation as a Community asset does not prevent planning permission being issued – This is a commercial matter – asset status gives community first refusal on land purchase and down to the community to raise the funds to buy the asset;

NOTE: Members would like front elevation windows to be in proportion

I also wanted further information from the agent in respect of the steep bank at the back of the site as the plans had made no reference to the change in levels or the bungalow at the back either and a new block plan too. The Conservation Officer also felt that the scale of the dwelling on this small site would have appeared overly dominant in the street scene and therefore a street scene elevation was requested. Although some revised plans did come in in early March, I did not feel that I had sufficient information to proceed further with the scheme.

However in the light of the comments from the Agenda Setting Meeting and their request for only slight changes to the appearance of the proposed dwelling, provided that plans were submitted showing the revised elevations the application can now be determined. These plans came into today they should be uploaded onto Idox later.

As a result this application will be dealt with under delegated powers for approval subject to the completion of a S106 agreement for an affordable housing contribution".

After discussions it was RESOLVED that Clerk reiterates our previous comments and also state that Clirs are disappointed that this will not go to committee for determination.

9) Parish matters/problems:

a) Parish problems:

the following problems were reported:

- Furniture (tables/chairs)placed on roadside by Chorley Chapel which make it more difficult for this area to be used as a 'turning area' Clerk will SC ask who this land belongs to.
- Dog mess on the road at High Green and also large dog often on road which frightens the children (possibly from Willowdene).
- Ferney Hall bends potholes and vehicles are driving in the middle of the road to avoid these.
- Duddlewick bends tarmac laid but deep drops off the road edge has been left which could be potentially dangerous if a vehicle goes off the edge.
- Walton junction potholes and road surface breaking up badly back towards Bagginswood.
- Bottom of Burnt Pitt bank by the brook deep pothole.
- Bold Farm large amount of scrap washing machines dumped on the side of the road. It was also queried why such a large amount of tarmac has been lai on this area when this could have been used to fill other potholes in the area.

- Stanley Farm Lane drainage problem. Matt Home is prepared to carry out this work and Clerk has already asked Highways to contact Matt.
- Clerk will ask how much the tubs of tarmac cost which the PC could buy and then ask Willowdene to fill some of the potholes.
- Clerk will also chase the litterbin which was promised by Chorley Chapel.
- Honeysuckle Lane was closed to 'clear blockages' and it was queried what this
 entailed/meant. Clerk will ask SC for clarification.
- Traffic lights not working correctly at The Deserts.

Cllr Hamilton-Russell had emailed Clerk pointed out that possible fly tipping (gas bottles been thrown into hedge) had been seen by Random Castle – vehicle registration fed into Police.
