# **Stottesdon and Sidbury Parish Council**

## Parish Council meeting held on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> October 2022 at 7.30pm in Chorley Village Hall.

**Present:** Cllrs D Young (Chairman), M Pearce, S Allen, Z Griffin, R Abbiss. Shropshire Cllr S Harris Parishioners: 1 Clerk Mrs F Morris

The Chairman asked that once the meeting starts that he aims for a 9.30pm finish at the latest and that only 1 Cllr speaks at a time. This is as per our Standing Orders and to help the Clerk with taking the minutes accurately.

#### 0) Public participation:

The parishioner present is interested in the Casual Vacancy, so Clerk suggested that she attended the meeting to see what happens. The closing date of the advertisement is not until 25<sup>th</sup> October so co-option cannot take place until after that date,

#### 1) Apologies for absence:

Clerk explained that following on from the question regarding apologies raised by Cllr Kennett last month no reasons for non-attendance or approval need to be given, just note apologies received. Apologies received from Cllrs L Grey, S Crawford, D Powell, R Kennett

## 2) Declaration of Interests

## 3) To confirm minutes of the meeting held on 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2022:

These had been circulated with the agenda and it was **RESOLVED to accept these as a true record** and Chairman signed these.

#### 4) Matters arising from minutes:

a. Clerk's report:

Following the comment made last month regarding the hedge removal at Northwood Lane it appears that this is possibly Stanley Farm. Clerk confirmed that this had obviously been reported to SC as Enforcement notification had been received.

#### Reply from Shropshire Council:

There was a team on Riddings Lane on Thursday the 29<sup>th</sup> September repairing a large edge break, which required a large amount of tarmac hence the extra vehicle, the road had to be closed, 2 vehicles for the traffic management 2 teams plus the additional vehicle with the tarmac, the two teams were used to cut down the length of time the road would be closed.

The Duddlewick to Cleobury North has 28 outstanding road defects, I will try and get a completion date from our contractor and update you when I have a date.

The H bar is for our traffic section as this is new, I was trying to find an enquiry relating to this on our system with no luck so far, please can you let me know how this was raised.

Reply from Police:

Sorry if your colleagues are unhappy with the level of attendance. This is something we are trying to work on and increase as the Neighbourhood Charter reflects. I have spoken to the ladies, and we are trying to ensure that either a member of our team attends, or we send you a brief update for your area.

Shelly is on duty for the 24<sup>th</sup> October and I have asked her to attend the meeting. This will be her priority commitment, however there is always a chance that an operational requirement takes her away.

We are aware of the current trend in rural crime and there are steps being taken to combat this. I will ask that Shelly brings any advice literature with her and also ask that we promote the NEIGHBOURHOOD MATTERS alert system further. It is increasingly important that members of the communities keep their eyes open and note any suspicious activity and let us know registrations etc. Regarding the school, as you are aware we have looked at this and I have no real solutions to offer. The road layout is, as most of the villages, not ideal for school and rural traffic to cross paths. I will however ask my team to try and pay passing attention at relevant times to see if there are any real time issues they can deal with.

Clerk confirmed that when the new Officer took over this area, he attended our PC meeting and said he would endeavour to get someone attend our meetings, but this would depend on shifts, holidays, incidents etc.

Cllr Abbiss confirmed that John Campion, Police Crime Commissioner does not expect Police to attend every meeting.

#### Website:

Good to hear from you. The yearly fee you have with us covers the following:

- Hosting of the website (diskspace & bandwidth)
- Backup of the website (40 days rolling backups)
- Telephone and Email support with issues
- SSL Certificate
- Security updates for the website platform.

Email wise our recommendation would be Office 365; we have a package for Parish Councils which includes a 365 Business Basic License and Support for £9.50/user/month.

This was raised by Cllrs Grey and Griffin and would wait until Cllr Grey is present at the meeting to discuss further.

Walton Bank hedge/gateway: reply from Planning Officer, SC:

I can confirm the above application has been withdrawn.

Cllrs asked that an Enforcement notice is completed requesting that the gate is removed, stones removed, hedge reinstated to its original position and the grit bin is replaced. Clerk has already requested a new grit bin.

Cllr Abbiss reported the road to Hawkswood from the bridge needs dealing with – barriers down towards the brook.

Cllrs discussed this fully and **RESOLVED to support with the following comments being sent to SC:** Councillors raised no objections to this application but as per previous applications we have asked for these buildings to be screened. These buildings are very prominent from Riddings Lane and Wribley Bank roads which are directly opposite this site driving from Chorley to Stottesdon. The building in the neighbouring field was moved down the field and is well screened by trees and is

therefore unobtrusive.

In the Design and Access statement for application number 20/02504/AGR point number 5 states 'The new building is to be sited within the farmed area in a position screened from roads, paths and residential properties' - this is certainly not the case. They are very visible from all around this site. We would be obliged that screening is given serious consideration when determining this application due to its very prominent position.

## 8) Parish matters/problems:

a) <u>Tree planting, Glebe Drive – reply from STAR Housing:</u>

Sorry for the delay but yes, we'd have no problem with you planting a tree there.

Let me know if you need any help with obtaining a tree or planting it on the day.

Or if not, can you let me know when it's been finalised, as we'd like to confirm the locations suitable for the tree. I'm sure you'll consider this anyway, but we just need to be confident its not going to cause us any issues when mowing grass, or when the tree grows, etc.

Cllr Pearce will now speak to Mark Link at Farlow Farm Nurseries for his advice on a suitable tree and will be happy to plant this for the Parish Council., A plaque will have to be sourced.

b) Brooksmeeting Bridge closure – 14<sup>th</sup> November-9<sup>th</sup> December:

As a new home is due to be delivered to Homelands on 23<sup>rd</sup> November, Clerk was asked if this would be allowed through. Clerk made enquiries.

Reply: Kier have advised my they can accommodate the movement if the delivery can get through the site between 8.30 am and 10.30am on the 23<sup>rd</sup> November.

# c) SALC – Warm Hubs – any update:

Cllr Allen had not enquired at the Fighting Cocks but would do. There could be transport issues for some residents if this is set up.

d) any others:

- Road is subsiding further (cracks in road getting wider) in Desert Woods could this be dealt with when the road is closed for the Brooksmeeting bridge work? Clerk will ask.
- 30mph sign coming up Burnt Pitt Bank has been hit.
- The property Edgewood, Bagginswood is getting bigger with 2 caravans being lived in, large workshop erected, business being run from there, including possible dog breeding, all without planning permission. The watercourse had also been filled in. Clerk was asked to complete Enforcement Notice for this again as nothing has been enforced,
- Bagginswood still needs repairing in the previously reported places. Notification has been received that work is planned for 2023/24 but only from Labrador back to the Kinlet junction possible the better piece of road! Clerk will report again.
- Millennium Oak tree at Sidbury needs the lower branches cutting off Cllr Pearce will deal with this.
- Signpost in The Square arm been missing for years Clerk will report again.
- Sidbury road sunk by Rectory Farm small car could 'bottom' on this.
- Brooksmeeting/Hawkswood road barriers fallen down towards brook.
- BW fallen trees over Jack Mytton Way on Billingsley side of road (opposite Rays Farm).
- Gate on BW at the top of Bakehouse Lane is not very horse user friendly and heavy to open. Clerk will contact ROW.
- Clerk reported stone on road edge between Honeysuckle Brook turn and Autumn Grove entrance which had damaged their car tyre, rim, and trim. S. Cllr Harris will bring this up at Farlow & Oreton PC meeting. Clerk has also reported this to SC.
